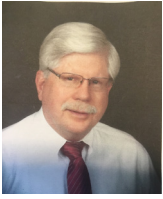


Karen Lydick

Area 6 - Madison County

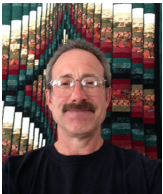

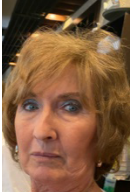


Bob Austin
