Ann Clark, Area 3 Winner Clinton County RTA

Area 3 Clock Winner, Ann Louise Clark, was born a preemie with her twin sister, Jane Marie Tietz, in Louisville, KY. She grew up in Jasper, Indiana, went to Indiana State University, and graduated in 1969 with a B. A. in Education. After marrying David Lee CLARK, Ann moved to Frankfort, IN, the same year. Ann received her master's degree from IU-Kokomo in 1974. She taught 29 years with the Community Schools of Frankfort, mostly in second grade.

Ann's husband died of cancer in 1995. She has 2 married daughters and sons-in-law, and 7 grandchildren living in Fishers and Indianapolis.

Ann's volunteer hours are for church and community. She has been a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church since her move to Frankfort. Ann is serving as a lector/reader, song leader, catechist for RCIA for children, extraordinary minister of Communion to our home-bound/nursing home parishioners and at Mass, a charter member and spiritual advisor of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul St. Mary Indiana Conference, and president of Ladies of Charity that do funeral dinners and monthly shut-in visits.

To help the community, Ann serves as the liaison between her church and her local pregnancy resource center. She coordinates her church's fundraising for their Rock-A-Thon, life banquet, and baby bottle campaign. Several times a month, Ann volunteers at the information desk at IU Health Frankfort Hospital. She continues to work the elections in Frankfort as a judge. She is a member of Alpha Delta Kappa women's educator organization and a past president. Ann is also past president and member of Clinton County Retired Teacher Association and now send cards as corresponding secretary and informs Julie at the Indiana Retired Teacher Association office of any deaths for necrology committee. Reading to preschoolers at another church and k-2 at our public schools for Frankfort's library literacy program has been enjoyable.

On a personal level, Ann helped her 85-year-old neighbor, and friend for over 30 years by being her alternate POA when her only 2 surviving grandchildren worked. This included taking her to dr. appointments, making business phone calls with her hearing problems, shopping, and visiting to check on her. She passed away this Valentine's Day.

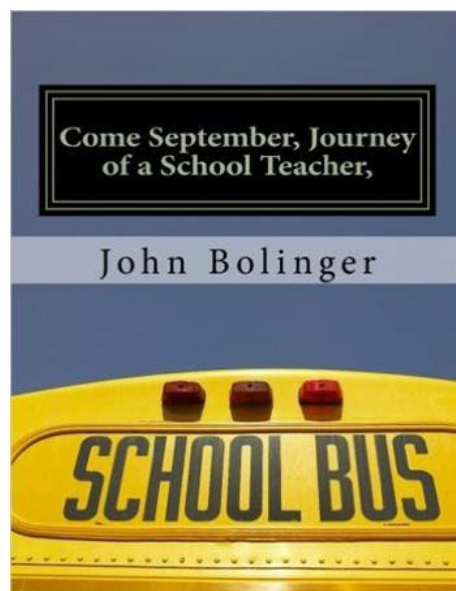


A Book by One of Our IRTA Members...

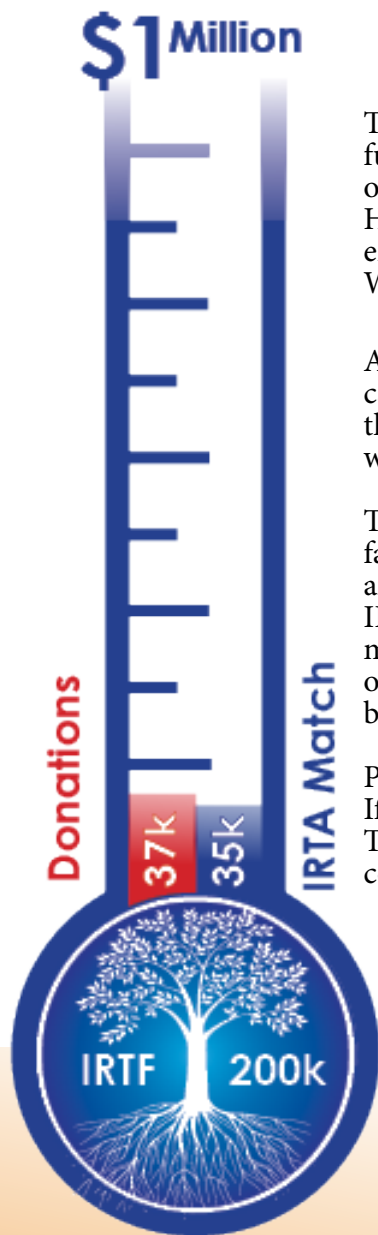

IRTF Endowment Campaign

The Indiana Retired Teachers Foundation (IRTF) Endowment Campaign is in full swing! The annual interest from a \$1 million endowment fund will sustain our three very successful programs (Scholarships, Active Teacher Grants, and A Hand UP). The Foundation moved \$200,000 from its investments to begin the endowment, and the IRTA will match all donations of \$50 or more, up to \$400,000. With your help, the formation of this endowment is very attainable!

All Indiana retired teachers have received a flyer outlining the endowment campaign and notes from previous program recipients. As of September 30, 2019, the endowment contributions total nearly \$45,000, so we are over one-fourth of the way to our \$1 million goal!

There are many ways to contribute to the endowment. I personally challenge all farm families to sell some grain this harvest for the IRTF. The IRTF has established an account with The Andersons, so you can tag a load or part of a load to go to the IRTF and that donation would not be taxable farm income. Let me know if you market your grain elsewhere and we can open an account there. If you are 70 ½ or older, please consider making an IRA Charitable Rollover, which also offers tax benefits.

Please remember that any donation of \$50 or more will be doubled by the IRTA! If your contribution is \$250 or more, you can also receive an apple on the Giving Tree. When making a contribution, please make sure that you denote that your contribution is for the endowment or make your check out to the IRTF Endowment.

The story behind this year's "13th check" and the State Legislature...

There is a saying "If you're not at the table, you're on the menu." This almost happened with retired educators and our stipend (13th check). If it were not for the IRTA, we may have lost it.

Do you like the stipend (13th check) you receive in September?

You can thank the IRTA. For 36 years there has been either COLA or a 13th check added to our pension payment. In the spring of 2019, it appeared all was going well as the Indiana House had the 13th check in their budget bill. However, on April 10th it was found that the Indiana Senate had taken funding for the 13th check out of the budget bill. Steve Beebe, lobbyist for IRTA and Tom Mellish, IRTA Executive Director, worked with their contacts and mobilized IRTA members to contact the governor and their state senators and representatives. Because we (the IRTA) were at the table (actively lobbying for the 13th check), we did not end up being served on the menu.

Many thanks to those of you who contacted the governor and your senators and/or representatives. These contacts were a great support to the work of Steve and Tom, and the legislators knew that IRTA members were paying close attention. Because of this, there will be a "13th check" stipend in 2019 and 2020.
